# **4<sup>th</sup> IBERO-AMERICAN ROAD SAFETY CONGRESS**

The Latin America and Caribbean Region has registered for decades a high number of traffic accidents, not only in the rural roads, but also in the urban areas. Traffic accidents are now one of the leading causes of death in the region, especially for the age group of 5-44 years. Around 100,000 people are killed in road accidents yearly and more than 5 million are injured.

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), these figures are 10 and 20 times higher than in other industrialized regions. In addition, it is estimated that the economic losses from road accidents reached in some countries of region to 4.5% of GDP.

According to WHO, if nothing is done to curb this trend, the annual deaths caused by road accidents worldwide will raise two million by 2030. Thereby, the virulence of traffic accidents will be located at the level of diseases like AIDS.

WHO and United Nations (UN) started the Decade of Action for Road Safety 2011-2020", an initiative that promotes the implementation of urgent and effective measures to minimize accidents and road deaths.

Following this philosophy of work, many multilateral bodies such as the Inter-American Development Bank, the World Bank and the Latin American Development Bank have developed initiatives to improve road safety in the region. For example, the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) launched the Road Safety Strategy and Action Plan 2010 -2015 five years ago. Since the implementation of these programs, the outlook for road safety in Latin America and the Caribbean has achieved significant improvements, although there is an enormous work to be done.

Creation of national road safety agencies, comprehensive awareness campaigns, incorporation of safety standards in vehicles and active collaboration with multilateral agencies are some of the most important milestones, as well as the launch of a major international organization as the Ibero-American Road Safety Observatory (OISEVI).

In this context, the Ibero-American Road Safety Congress (CISEV) traveled to Costa Rica in 2008 to celebrate its first edition. This new commitment, a pioneer in the region, was born with the intention to lead a process of sharing knowledge and experiences on road safety in Latin American countries.

After a successful first edition, with more than 350 participants and nearly 200 conference delegates, the CISEV continued on his way, stopping in 2010 in Argentina and Colombia in 2012.

Since its inception, the growth of this international forum has not ceased. In its three previous editions, the CISEV shows an impacting balance: 3000 delegates from over 25 countries presented 500 lectures, over 5,000 m<sup>2</sup> of commercial exhibitions and nearly one hundred



exhibitors. There is no doubt that the CISEV has become a must stop for all international road safety experts.

The Mexican city of Cancun is the next station CISEV. The 4<sup>th</sup> edition of this international meeting will be held between September 30<sup>th</sup> and October 2<sup>nd</sup> 2014, under the slogan "Progress of the Decade of Action for Road Safety Decade. Together we can save lives".

The 4<sup>th</sup> edition of CISEV is organized by the Ibero-American Road Institute (IVIA) and has the support of the Ministry of Health, through the National Council for the Prevention of Accidents (CONAPRA), and the Ministry of Transport of the Government of Mexico. It is also promoted by the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB), the Development Bank of Latin America (CAF-CAF), as well as the National Road Safety Agency of the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Transport of the Government of Argentina, the Traffic Directorate (DGT) of the Ministry of Spain and the Spanish Road Association (AEC).

Choosing Mexico to host the 4<sup>th</sup> CISEV was not accidental. It should be recalled that road safety is a top priority of the Mexican government. Each year, over 24,000 people are killed on the roads of the country; almost 750,000 serious injuries and 40,000 cases of disability are additional consequences.

In addition, traffic accidents are the leading cause of death for the Mexican population between 5 and 34 years, with particularly serious in the case of children as these claims are the second cause of orphanhood. The human drama involving these figures must be added the costs of all kinds they generate. Mexican authorities estimate that the figure is 6,500 million euros per year.

This question and many others will be discussed in depth during the 4<sup>th</sup> CISEV. Therefore, its thematic structure is varied and extensive, ranging from design and planning of infrastructure to mobility management, active and passive vehicle safety and driver education, leaving aside more specific aspects such as legislation and health response after accidents.




# IV CISEV COMMERCIAL EXHIBITION
